

APPLICANTS INVITED BY ITALIAN/EU NATIONAL RESIDING IN ITALY

- 1) Application form duly filed in English or Italian, in capital letter. The form must be signed and dated by the applicant, or in case of a minor the form must be signed by parent(s) or legal guardian. The visa application form can be downloaded from the website www.ambislamabad.esteri.it or www.italyvisa-pakistan.com/Islamabad/
- 2) Two color passport-size photographs no older than 6 months, in white background and un-edited. One photograph must be glued on the visa application and the second one, bearing on the reverse side the applicant's full name, should be attached to the application form with a paper clip.
- 3) Passport valid for at least 18 months from the date of visa application. Only machine-readable passports are accepted. Passport must have at least two blank pages. All previous passport(s), if any, are to be attached. In case of lost passport(s), the Police Report must be attached in original to the form.
- 4) Copies of passport, ID, Citizenship certificate of the inviting EU/Italian National.
- 5) Residential Certificate of the EU/Italian National issued by the competent Italian Authority (up to 6 months old from the date of release).
- 6) Proof/detail of work/job/salary/bank statement of the inviting EU/Italian National.
- 7) Invitation Letter duly signed and filled by the inviting EU/Italian National.
- 8) Family Certificate and Civil Status Certificate of the Inviting EU/Italian National issued by the competent Italian Authority (up to 6 months old from the date of release).
- 9) If the applicant has been denied a Visa by an Embassy/High Commission in the last two years, written relation concerning the reason of travel and refusal (copy of refusal letter could be attached to the form).
- 10) Original and copy of the Family Registration Certificate of the applicant, attested by MoFA, legalized by the Embassy and translated in Italian.

Requested documents for spouse/children of EU/Italian National

- 1) Proof of marriage registration by the competent Italian/EU State Authority.
- 2) Original and copy of the Marriage Certificate/Nikah Nama attested by MoFA, legalized by the Embassy and translated in Italian.
- 3) Original and Copy of Birth Certificate(s), attested by MoFA, legalized by the Embassy and translated in Italian.
- 4) Original and Copy of the Children Registration Certificate(s), attested by MoFA and translated in Italian as a supporting document.
- 5) In case the applicant is below 18 years of age, and travelling alone, consent letter (Affidavit) from mother/father residing in Pakistan along with his/her ID copy.
- 6) In case the applicant is above 21 years of age, the last year of money transfer receipts from Italy to Pakistan in favor of his/her son/daughter, or documents proving that the applicant is a student and he/she is not employed.

- 7) In case of adoption, only the formal decree of the court will be accepted as a supporting document. The adoption decree must also fulfill the requirements set by the Italian CAI (Commissione Adozioni Internazionali – International Adoption Commission)

Requested documents for parents of EU/Italian National

- 1) Birth Certificate of the EU/Italian National, issued by the competent local Authority in the country of birth or by the competent Italian/EU Member State Authority, in which the name of both parents is mentioned.
- 2) Regular and systematic proof of economic dependency (bank statement, receipt of payments...)

With reference to the status of British citizens residing in the European Union, the procedure relating to "Brexit" was concluded on 31 January 2020, with the entry into force of the agreement between the European Union and the United Kingdom. The Withdrawal Agreement (2019 / C 384 I / 01) entered into force on 1 February 2020 and, as of that date, the United Kingdom has become a third country. As of 01 January 2021, the United Kingdom has been included in Annex II of Reg. (EU) 2018/1806, which contains the list of third countries whose citizens are exempt from the visa requirement for short stays (up to 90 days).

However, British citizens already residing in Italy on 31/12/2020 and regularly registered in the Registry of their Municipality of residence (with certificate of registration) may request a residence document from the Police Headquarters of residence in application of the rights deriving from the Withdrawal Agreement (Articles 18 and 19). Therefore, the facilities provided by the Visa Code for EU citizens and their families will continue to apply to them, in application of Directive 2004/38 / EC, as specified in the Agreement itself.

- An application without a complete set of documents will be rejected
- The Embassy reserves the right to ask for additional supporting documents
- Any forged/fake documents will be reported to the relevant Authorities
